After completion of the inaugural session all the volunteers and contingent leaders moved to the camp destination Padmashri B. V Raju Institute of Technology, Narsapur. Day one was completed with all the students reached to their accommodation places at the venue.

Second day was started at 6 AM with physical exercise as the camps will start with physical fitness for each and every volunteer. At 8 AM all the participants joined at the FLAG HOISTING ceremony and National flag will be hoisted by one contingent leader from

one state and NSS Flag will be hoisted by another contingent leader of another state. This procedure will be followed till the end of the camp.

There are participants from 9 different states of India. The states participated are Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Odessa, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh. Total strength of the camp is 140.

After completion of breakfast, all the volunteers will move for fresh up and come back to the seminar hall at sharp 9:30 AM. Intellectual sessions and social awareness programs will be conducted till lunch. After lunch another session will be followed and some activities will be conducted for the participant volunteers.
